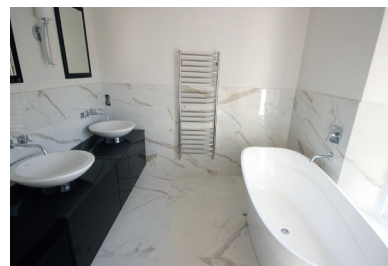

What the judges said:

"Tim and Liam have taken an architectural approach to this bathroom and their design has succeeded. There's a lot of attention to detail so the bathroom works as a stand-alone design but also blends with the design of the whole house. A really confident use of plywood, over a standard white finish, to offset against the greys - the finished look is very different from your average bathroom and it's a really superior finish with a very small budget."
